As always, around the country, there was plenty of competitive fun in our area meetings, matches against other schools' alumni and Eagles events.

Behind the scenes, planning is well under way for celebrations to mark the OUGS centenary in 2025. Lots of good ideas across the season are being fleshed out, but at the core will be a two-day event over Friday 11<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> July, involving golf at Luffenham Heath and a big centenary dinner at Uppingham. ### Captain's Meeting & AGM 2023

**Jeremy Cooke's (WB 67)** Captain's Meeting, and the 2023 AGM of the society, were held at Trevose Golf & Country Club in Cornwall over the weekend of 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> October. Developed over many years into a top golf and holiday venue by OU owner, the late **Peter Gammon (WD 49)**, Trevose has hosted seven previous OUGS Captain's meetings, starting in 1997. Sadly, Peter died since our last visit, but Trevose is now run by a very professional team, led by his son, who ensured that we were looked after every bit as well as in previous years. Captain Cooke had even organised for fine sunny weather over the weekend, adding an extra element of pleasure to the golf and social activities enjoyed by the 29 OUGS members and their 19 partners who attended the meeting.

On the Saturday, the Acorn Trophy for the best stableford score was won by **Brian Cooke (Hf 53)** with an astonishing 42 points on his 84<sup>th</sup> birthday! The Lee Tankard for the best gross score was won by **Chris Gotla (H 68)** on countback from **Jeremy Cooke (WB 67)**. Both shot 77. Other prize-winners were **Alistair Fisher (WD 65)**, **David Downes (L 59)**, **Robert Pope (WD 60)**, **Jeremy Cooke (WB 67)** and **Richard Venables (H 60)**. The Rutland Tankard for outstanding service to the society over the year was awarded to **Tom Hayes (SH 74)**. On Sunday, the Christopherson Rosebowls were won by **Brian Cooke (Hf 53)** and **Mike Ingham (M 66)**.

At the AGM, **Richard Bernhard (B 64)** was confirmed as Captain for 2024, and **Tim Dickson (SH 67)** was elected Vice-Captain. **Alan Thomas (H 62)**, **Mike Ingham (M 66)** and **Stuart Lloyd (WD 74)** were confirmed as President, Treasurer and Tournament Secretary respectively and **Tom Hayes (SH 74)** was elected interim Secretary until a replacement for our very recently deceased long-serving Secretary, Martin Walker (see below) is appointed.

Richard's Captain's Meeting will be held at St Pierre Country Club at Chepstow over the weekend of 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> September 2024. St Pierre has two fine 18 hole golf courses as well as a spa/leisure centre and other facilities expected of a 4<sup>\*</sup> Marriott group hotel. Our over-65 Senior Darwin team, comprising Nick Freeman, David Stewart, Jeremy Cooke, Richard Pattrick (F 66), David Pattrick (F 65) and Robert Pope (WD 60) beat Eton 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>:<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> in the first round but lost 1:2 to Harrow in the second. Tonbridge beat Charterhouse in the final. Highgate won the Veterans (over-75s) scratch competition, beating our pair of David Downes (L 59) and Anthony Walker (L 61).

#### **Northern Public Schools Meeting**

Held at Woodhall Spa, Uppingham once again won the Birkdale Bucket (team prize). We were middle of the pack at the Luffenham Heath Public Schools meeting but did not sparkle at the Midland Public Schools meeting at Little Aston.

### **Silver Tassie**

For the first time, Uppingham fielded a team of two pairs in this Ladies competition at The Berkshire GC. **Rebecca Haywood (Fd 81)** and **Alice Dickson (L 06)** had a better ball score of 41 stableford points on the Blue course, while **Clare Warman (LH 75)** and **Debbie Lewin (Fd 83)** scored 36 points on the Red course. Their team aggregate score was just 1 stableford point behind the first three teams, all finishing on 78 points. That secured them 4<sup>th</sup> place out of 26 schools participating – a fantastic result. The winners on countback were Wycombe Abbey.

### **Area Meetings & Matches**

The OUGS Merseyside Meeting was held in April at Ormskirk this year and was won by **Rick Taylor** (M 59) with 33 points from **David Arthur (SH 63)** and **Andrew Renison (F 54)**, both with 32 points.

The West Midlands & Spring meeting in May at Little Aston saw **David Hopkins (WD 60)** win with 36 points from **Rick Taylor (M 59)** with 33 points.

The London Area Meeting in September at Piltdown was won by **Alan Thomas (H 62)** with 36 points from **Andrew Morgan (Fgh 74)**, second on countback, and **Andrew Weiss (H 64)**, both with 33 points.

At their many matches around the country, OUGS teams registered wins over the alumni of Repton, Oundle, Sedburgh Nottingham, Eastbourne and Loretto and also won the matches against The School and the Piltdown GC team. There were draws with the alumni of St Pauls and Giggleswick and losses in matches against Westminster, Uppingham Rovers, Sedburgh, Oundle, Rugby, The Leys, Ampleforth, Cheltenham and Malvern.
